OFFICIAL STATEMENT


Both parties came together Monday afternoon, joined by the Chair of the Elections Committee, Olga Lykhvar. It has been clarified that the decision of the Elections Committee stands that the Cano/Hillyard campaign remains disqualified. Further, it has been addressed that the intention of involving a third party review would have simply been for an opinion, and would not have affected the final outcome.

The Vasquez/Abercrombie and Cano/Hillyard campaign have agreed to move forward and put the election at rest. We acknowledge the uniqueness of the situation and will work to ensure that procedures are in place for forthcoming ASASUD elections.

The past three weeks have been an opportunity to gain awareness and understanding of what downtown students hope to see from their student government.
